School Board Works to Streamline Bus Schedules

WSESU Intensive Services K-6 District Program coming to Dummerston School: In May, the Dummerston Town School Board voted to welcome the WSESU Intensive Services District Program for K-6 students to the Dummerston School beginning in fall 2007. This district program serves K-6 students identified as having severe to profound impairments, delayed adaptive behavior and social skills, and a lack of progress with significant intervention in less restrictive environments. At the elementary (K-6) level, the program's focus is to include the student in the school community and to help the student become as independent as possible. Each student has an individual paraeducator to enable him/her to participate in regular education activities as fully as is feasible. When not in a regular education setting, the Intensive Services students will work in their own classroom with their paraeducator and specialized services personnel (i.e. physical, occupational, speech therapists). For fall 2007, seven students are expected to participate in this program.

The Dummerston Town School Board is pleased that this district program is moving to the Dummerston School after eighteen years at Academy School. It allows Dummerston School to diversify its student population, to generate additional annual revenue and to showcase the Dummerston School within the WSESU community. While Intensive Services students at Dummerston School cannot be included in our student count (used to calculate per pupil cost), they can be included in Dummerston School's free and reduced lunch program count as long as they qualify for this federal program (used to determine eligibility for federal funds). While the intensive services program will increase the number of personnel and cars at the Dummerston School, please remember that this program is funded by the WSESU, not by the Dummerston School.

Summer Meeting Schedule: With no meetings scheduled in July, the Dummerston Town School Board will meet on August 7th and August 21st at 6:30 p.m. in the Dummerston School library. Your thoughts and ideas are welcome. If you can't attend a meeting, please contact any board member. Contact and agenda information is available at dummerstonschool.org and at the town hall. The board will resume its regular meeting schedule in September (second and fourth Tuesdays of each month).

School Bus Schedule 2007-2008: In July, board members will be working with WSESU central office staff and Laidlaw Transportation to streamline bus schedules and pick up/drop off points for the 2007-2008 school year. Thank you in advance for your support as we make Dummerston School's bus schedule more efficient.
